

General Sales Tax (Amendment) Act, 2024

Effective as of January 1st, 2025

The Belize Tax Service Department (BTSD) announces key amendments to the General Sales Tax Act (GST), Cap. 63, introducing electronic invoicing provisions, compliance measures, and penalties.

Key Changes, Amended Sections & Impact on Taxpayers

1. Mandatory GST Registration & Penalties (Amended: Section 22)

Impact: Businesses failing to register for GST will face penalties.

Taxpayer Obligation: Register for GST if your business meets the eligibility criteria.

2. Extended Input Tax Claim Period (Amended: Section 33)

Impact: Businesses now have **one year (instead of six months)** to claim input tax credits.

Taxpayer Obligation: Submit input tax claims within the revised deadline.

3. Transition to Electronic Invoicing (Amended: Section 36, Section 36A & Section 96 sub-section [2])

Impact: Businesses must comply with electronic invoicing and digital receipt requirements.

Taxpayer Obligation: Prepare for the mandatory switch to electronic invoicing.

4. Stricter GST Compliance Rules (Amended: Section 90 sub-section [3])

Impact: Businesses cannot advertise "GST included" prices if not registered for GST—this is now an offense.

Taxpayer Obligation: Ensure pricing displays comply with GST regulations.
